At present the library has a collection of over 21922 books and subscribes to 282 National & International Journals and 10 magazines. The Library subscribes to 6 online databases covering Engineering, Law, Management and Humanities areas. The collection of the library is growing continuously on an everyday basis. Other collections in the library include CDs, question papers and periodicals. The Library is completely automated using KOHA software and the OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue) is accessible all over the campus. The RFID security system has been successfully implemented.
