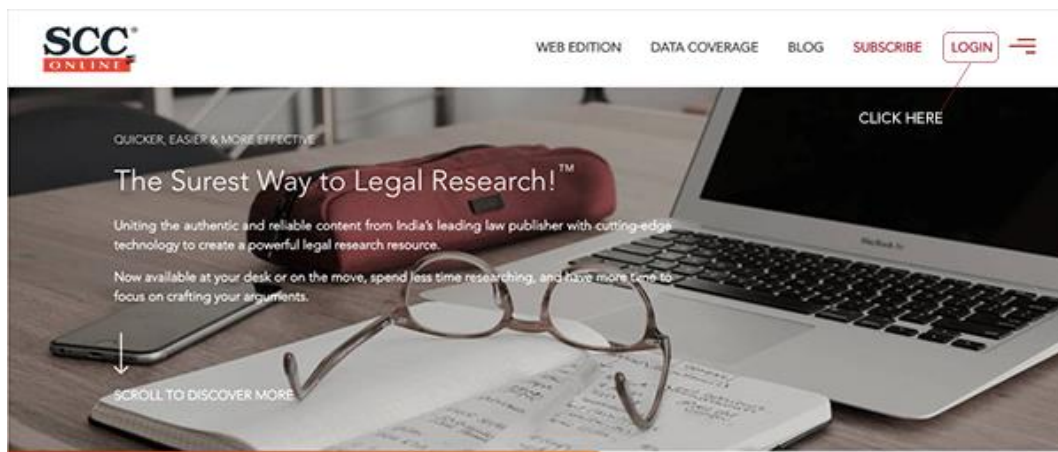


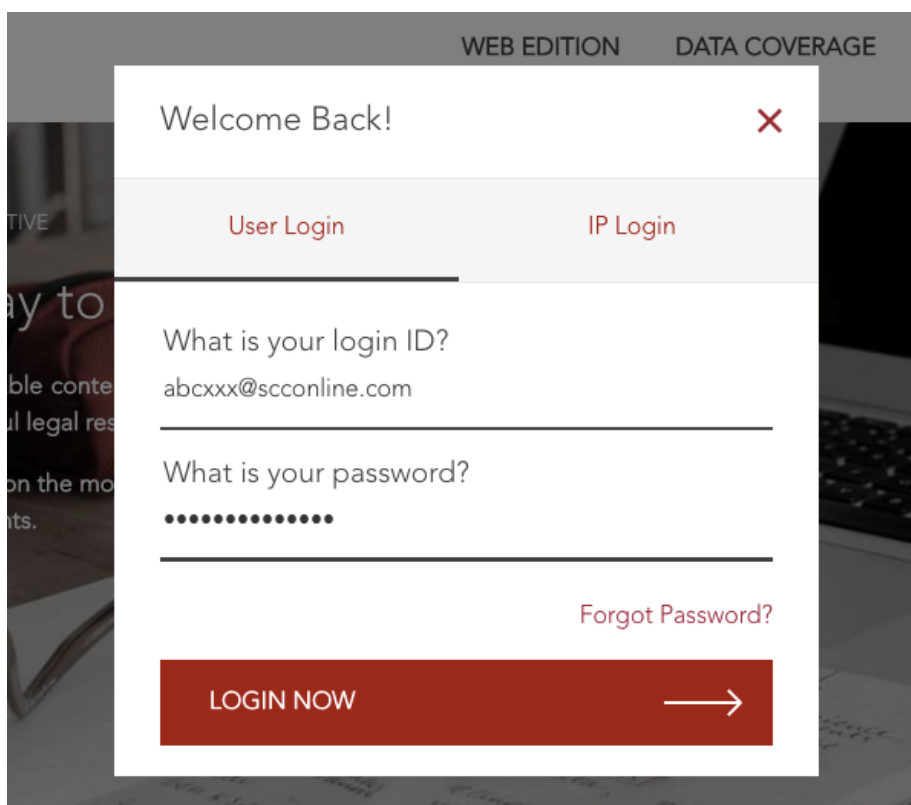

How To: Login to your Account

Open URL - www.sconline.com and click on Login as shown in image 1.



Enter your Registered Login ID (email ID or mobile number) and password as shown in image 2.

Everything is just a click away and neatly organised in a "tile" design. The methods of search and data retrieval have now been categorized into three major segments. A click on any of the tiles then takes you to the search screen of your choice.



Let us look at an example to see how these tiles function:
Clicking on **WORD SEARCH** tile it will navigate you to the familiar text search screen.
